


Sekisui House breaks the record with 92% net zero energy house in fiscal 2021.

Initiatives to make net-zero-energy common across both single and multifamily homes, to enhance resilience and take action on climate change.

Sekisui House, Ltd. achieved a record with 92% of all our newly built detached houses being net zero energy house* in fiscal 2021. Sekisui House has now built a cumulative total of 69,163 net zero energy house as of the end of March 2022.

In addition, Sekisui House is promoting net-zero-energy in all of its multifamily residential buildings, including rental housing and condominiums for sale, and the number of net-zero-energy rental housing units ordered in FY2021 tripled from the previous year to 8,501 units, bringing the cumulative total to 12,307 units. As a result of these efforts, the annual reduction in CO2 emissions of the homes we supplied in fiscal 2021 reached 55% compared to the fiscal 2013 level. The number of units in net-zero-energy condominiums completed in fiscal 2021 was 160, bringing the cumulative total to 192 units.

In Japan, Sekisui House focuses on disaster resilience, such as selling houses that can provide a certain level of living even during power outages through a combination of solar cells, fuel cells, and storage batteries. We have also strengthened countermeasures against flooding under the floor in newly built detached houses.
